

# LAMMICO Patient Safety Award & Grant Application

2024-25 TOPIC: Early Recognition of Sepsis APPLICATION DUE DATE: MAY 31, 2025

## **Award Description**

LAMMICO is committed to patient/resident safety and risk management. To promote our commitment to the healthcare community, LAMMICO sponsors the Patient Safety Award & Grant. The topic of this year's award is Early Recognition of Sepsis. Hospitals, ambulatory surgery centers (ASC), and long-term care (LTC) facilities in Louisiana, Arkansas, Mississippi, Texas, and Tennessee are eligible to apply for this award (refer to Eligibility). The award application period opens July 1, 2024, and ends May 31, 2025. Entries must be received by midnight of the posted application due date. Promotion is subject to local, state, and federal laws, and is void where prohibited. Application submission implies acceptance of and agreement with award rules and conditions.

## **Background Information**

Sepsis remains a time-critical emergency. As with stroke and heart attack, the identification and response to sepsis should be urgent and protocol-based. Currently there are changing definitions of sepsis, various sepsis screening tools, standardized treatment bundles, and risk mitigation strategies available. Incorporating sepsis treatment guidelines should be an important part of clinical care.

All educational activities are offered free of charge to eligible facilities. These activities focus on information regarding the clinical manifestations of sepsis screening for the recognition of sepsis and septic shock, and liability risks and mitigation strategies associated with sepsis.

#### **Award Entry**

No purchase is necessary to apply for the grant or to win. Eligible facilities will submit this application for award entry. After the staff in the eligible facility complete the educational activity, assess and analyze your current sepsis mortality rate (or overall mortality rate if sepsis rate unavailable).

Review your current policies, procedures, protocols and/or processes to identify opportunities for improvement. Assess and analyze your patient/resident sepsis mortality rates after the implementation of changes. Report your changes and impact. To participate in the 2024-25 LAMMICO Patient Safety Award and Grant program, applicants are required to submit hard copy (print) or digital (electronic) examples of changes and improvements made to their current policy, procedure, protocol, and/or process and the amount of improvement that was realized in your sepsis mortality rates.

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## **Eligibility**

The award is open to hospitals, ambulatory surgery centers, and long-term care facilities in Louisiana, Arkansas, Mississippi, Texas, and Tennessee. Applicants are not required to be underwritten by LAMMICO to participate. Learn more about this year's program at lammico.com/grant.

### Selection

To further enhance your efforts toward patient/resident safety, LAMMICO sponsors this Award and Grant for the hospital, ambulatory surgery center, or long-term care facility that demonstrates the greatest reduction in annual mortality rates resulting from improved sepsis diagnosis and treatment as determined by a committee of LAMMICO Risk Management professionals. All judging decisions are final.

#### **Prizes**

The hospital, ambulatory surgery center or LTC facility that demonstrates the greatest reduction in annual mortality rates resulting from improved sepsis diagnosis and treatment will be awarded:

- A \$10,000 grant to the winner to be used for nursing professional development
  - One-year risk manager membership to the American Society for Health Care Risk Management (ASHRM) or LTC state association membership
  - One-year complimentary membership to Medical Interactive Community for all employees to access our risk management CME/CNE/MOC courses online
- A \$5,000 grant to the second place participant to be used for nursing professional development
  - One-year risk manager membership to the American Society for Health Care Risk Management (ASHRM) or LTC state association membership
  - One-year complimentary membership to Medical Interactive Community for all employees to access our risk management CME/CNE/MOC courses online
